**Prosecution Subcommittee Focus:** Enhance Prosecution of Gun Violence and Violent Crimes

Prosecution Subcommittee met three times and participated in the Citizens Safety Task Force Community Meetings

**Recommendation #1:** Implement Geographic Stewards Program in the Community

Implement a community prosecution model by which prosecutors from the State Attorney's Office and U.S. Attorney's Office will partner with the community and law enforcement to focus on identifying key offenders and working with them to interrupt the cycle of violence, reducing the incidents of crime and improving the quality of life for residents.

**Proposed Short-Term Action:** <u>Lack of funding and limited staffing</u> <u>has inhibited the progression of this recommendation</u>.



**Recommendation #2:** Implement Civil Citation Diversion Programs **Proposed Short-Term Actions:** Recommended Enhancements

- A. <u>Recommend law enforcement agencies to make the issuance of civil</u> <u>citations mandatory for eligible offenses and establish processes</u> <u>requiring officers to obtain approval for not using a civil citation in a</u> <u>given instance</u>.
- B. <u>Recommend law enforcement agencies publish statistics showing the</u> <u>number of citations issued</u>.
- C. <u>Recommend the SAO or law enforcement agencies publish statistics</u> <u>showing the number of instances in which citations could have been</u> <u>issued</u>.



**Recommendation #2:** Implement Civil Citation Diversion Programs Proposed Short-Term Actions (Continued):

- D. Recommend the SAO develop PSAs for the general public to be informed about civil citations so that they may be able to request that option, as well as inform the public that this program is not intended to represent a "soft" approach on crime; rather, that it allows law enforcement to focus on more significant crimes.
- E. <u>Recommend law enforcement introduce the program to new recruits</u> <u>during their onboard training.</u>





**Proposed Recommendation #3 (New):** *Identify a Legislative Advocate who will make recommendations for legislation that will create protections for witnesses and neighboring persons to facilitate their willingness to share information.* 

• <u>A specific recommendation to this end is to increase restrictive</u> parameters around sharing of information regarding witnesses.





**Proposed Recommendation #4 (New):** <u>State Attorney's Office to issue a</u> <u>statement of affirmation and commitment to prosecuting gun violence</u> <u>cases to the fullest extent possible.</u>

**Proposed Recommendation #5 (New):** Increase street cameras <u>universally and not just in target areas.</u>





**Proposed Recommendation 6 (New):** <u>Recommend the following</u> <u>questions be added to future Community Crime Surveys</u>:

- 1. If you have perpetrated a crime of gun violence, what would have prevented you from committing that crime?
- 2. <u>Have you had communication with prosecuting authorities in the past</u> year? If so, were you a victim or a witness?
- 3. Do you know how the prosecution system works? (Or similar question to assess familiarity with prosecution processes).

<u>Prevention Subcommittee Focus:</u> Youth primarily between the ages of 13 – 25 residing in zip codes where the incidence of violent crime is highest

Prevention Subcommittee held five meetings and members participated in the Citizens Safety Task Force community meetings

Prevention Subcommittee reviewed seven recommendations and modifications/revisions were made to three recommendations:

- Recommendation #2: Expand/Enhance Access to Effective Youth, and Parenting, Mental and Behavioral Health Programs
- Recommendation #5: Reduce Access to Illegal Firearms
- Recommendation #7: Communicate Key Issues and Programs to the Community

**Recommendation #2:** Expand/Enhance Access to Effective Youth, and Parenting, Mental and Behavioral Health Programs

#### **Proposed Short-Term Actions:**

A. Allocate funding to programs operated by "Credible Messengers" in the target zip codes.

"Credible Messengers" are defined herein as organizations, including small scale, and individuals who have longstanding trusted relationships with at-promise youth in the target zip codes and a legacy of effectively encouraging and supporting youth on the path to successful adulthood.

After one year of implementation, the County should review the impact of the program and determine if additional funding is needed to achieve program goals.

**Recommendation #2:** Expand/Enhance Access to Effective Youth, and Parenting, Mental and Behavioral Health Programs

#### **Proposed Short-Term Actions:**

B. Allocate <u>substantial</u> funding, <u>based upon budget recommendations of experts in the</u> <u>field</u>, to implement research-based models in the target zip codes, proven to prevent violent crime, including the following list of practices:

 Partner with municipalities within Orange County to implement evidence-based Community Violence Intervention (CVI) models into targeted County neighborhoods experiencing high incidences of gun violence. Ensure that the CVI model identifies the most lethal individuals at the center of gun violence and provides them with long-term wrap-around mentoring and supportive relationships, <u>and wrap around services</u>, <u>including housing, employment, mental health counseling and legal assistance</u> until the individuals have fully pivoted away from a life of violence and are firmly set in a productive, positive, crime-free lifestyle.

**Recommendation #2:** Expand/Enhance Access to Effective Youth, and Parenting, Mental and Behavioral Health Programs

#### **Proposed Short-Term Actions:**

C. <u>Implement</u> models that identify small, defined geographic areas and invest in cradle-to-career programs covering all aspects of child well-being in the zone (including academic achievement, health/wellness, youth employment and family economic stabilization) for children and youth who reside there, implemented by individuals and organizations in the neighborhood with the goal of connecting a critical mass of neighborhood youth to those programs. <u>Neighborhoods to be prioritized should be located in the 32703, 32801, 32805, 32810, 32811, 32818, 32822, and 32839 zip codes.</u>

**Proposed Recommendation #5:** Create and Implement a Blueprint for Local Gun Safety

#### **Proposed Short-Term Actions:**

A. <u>Utilize the Public Information Officer to disseminate information outlining</u> <u>the ways that HB 543 – commonly referred to as "Permitless Carry "or</u> <u>"Constitutional Carry" will affect our community, the public's access to guns,</u> <u>and the expected increases in gun violence</u>.

**Proposed Recommendation #5:** Create and Implement a Blueprint for Local Gun Safety

#### **Proposed Short-Term Actions:**

B. <u>Maintain a comprehensive review of State and Federal laws governing the</u> <u>sale, purchase, ownership, and carry of guns. Determine the extent of state</u> <u>and federal preemptions, so as to identify what is within the jurisdiction of</u> <u>local governments that can improve safety and education related to gun</u> <u>violence to implement policy, ordinance and code changes when legally</u> <u>feasible. For example, mandate that all locations selling guns including gun</u> <u>show expos, have overnight security guards/off-duty officers to prevent</u> <u>break-ins and theft.</u>

**Proposed Recommendation #5:** Create and Implement a Blueprint for Local Gun Safety

#### **Proposed Long-Term Action:**

A. <u>Create and implement Blueprint for Local Municipal involvement in</u> increasing Gun Safety education and collaborating with local and statewide Gun Safety advocates to organize advocacy for evidence-based Gun Safety legislation at the State and Federal Level.

**Recommendation #5:** *Create and Implement a Blueprint for Local Gun Safety* 

#### **Proposed Long-Term Actions:**

B. <u>Create an intersectional coalition to advise the Orange County Mayor</u> and Commission, the Orange County Sheriff's Office and the State Attorney for the Ninth Judicial Circuit, State of Florida and provide ongoing partnership in the following gun safety goals:

a. Identify a non-partisan partner organization who can lead these efforts (possibly the League of Women Voters)

**Recommendation #5:** Create and Implement a Blueprint for Local Gun Safety

#### **Proposed Long-Term Actions (Continued):**

b. Include representation from gun violence prevention organizations (like Giffords Law Center to prevent gun violence, March for Our Lives, Prevent Gun Violence Florida), healthcare and trauma response organizations, education, faith, tourism, LGBTQIA+ organizations, youth representation, state and federally elected officials.

c. Expand gun safety education across all ages and spaces in Orange County

**Recommendation #5:** Create and Implement a Blueprint for Local Gun Safety

#### **Proposed Long-Term Actions (Continued):**

d. <u>Expand education around "Common Sense Gun Safety Legislation" - legislative</u> <u>changes that are proven to reduce gun violence</u>

- Repeal Stand your Ground
- Prevent child access
- *Recording of lost/stolen firearms*

- Prohibit sales via the internet
- Mental health check for all who wish to purchase guns
- Waiting periods

- Strongly oversee gun sellers
- Comprehensive background checks including private transfers
- Eliminate "shall issue" to replace with "may issue"
- Stronger penalties to those who manufacture, sell and train people to use guns



# **Recommendation #7: Communicate Key Issues and Programs to the Community**

#### **Proposed Long-Term Actions:**

A. Develop and disseminate a robust social media communication campaign aimed at strengthening anti-violence *social norms* – especially among youth in the target zip codes – by using *social media*, print-based materials, web content, broadcast media (television and radio), telephone, and face-to-face interaction with individuals and large-group forums such as public meetings.



**Recommendation #7: Communicate Key Issues and Programs to the Community** 

**Proposed Long-Term Actions (Continued):** 

B. <u>Disseminate more information to the community, school district, and</u> <u>stakeholders regarding Orange County funded programs and services. This</u> <u>strategy would include working with the local media and the development of an</u> information clearinghouse to include but not be limited to event calendars, activities, resources, etc. that could be shared with the community.



**Recommendation #7: Communicate Key Issues and Programs to the Community** 

**Proposed Long-Term Actions (Continued):** 

C. <u>Utilize different modalities and platforms to get information directly to youth</u> and families. This would include pushing information out on various social media outlets. Orange County could push information to the social media sites they utilize. This information could then be shared to other platforms by the agencies, non-profits, and youth to further the messaging. Additionally, having youth assist in the development of social media campaigns will allow them to have a voice and empower them in making the change in the community.

Intervention Subcommittee Focus: To promote interagency cooperation and coordination among service providers in Orange County to assist with reducing gun violence and violent crimes pertaining to youth.

- Recommendation #7: Create a realistic channel for communication with the community and the youth



**Proposed Recommendation #1:** Develop a detailed plan that addresses generations of neglect and poverty by formulating a <u>3-year vision</u> with a systemic focus that reviews the structural changes that provide a healthy community where everyone thrives.

#### **Proposed Short-Term Action:**

B. Enhance the family support system to include prenatal care, childcare, and early childhood education.





**Recommendation #4:** Define, develop, and fund a credible messenger's program.

#### **Proposed Short-Term Action:**

D. Utilize a program that will respond during violent crisis to assist the individual and community affected by providing on going support services to individuals impacted by violent crime.





**Recommendation #5:** Coordinate with mental health providers to increase the number of providers in the areas identified and require the agencies to increase their hours of operation.

#### **Proposed Short-Term Action:**

A. <u>Teach and educate families, youth, and young adults on life skills programs</u> to include peace and conflict resolution skills.

**Enforcement Subcommittee Focus:** Review data and evidence-based enforcement strategies to reduce gun violence.

Enforcement Subcommittee met three times and members participated in the Citizens Safety Task Force community meetings

Enforcement Subcommittee heard from community stakeholders, and county staff as they reviewed the recommendations



Enforcement Subcommittee reviewed four recommendations and modifications/deletions were made to each recommendation and short-term and long-term actions:

Recommendation #1: Establish and maintain quarterly scheduled community public safety forums between law enforcement and community stakeholders over the next 12 months to review relevant data, solicit community input, and discuss and develop strategies to reduce gun/violent crimes.

Recommendation #2: Increase the community's and law enforcement's use of evidence-based practices and non-traditional approaches of community policing and engagement to further build public trust in communities historically distrustful of law enforcement and that are disproportionately impacted by gun/violent crimes.



Recommendation #3: Implement public safety workshops with law enforcement agencies and community stakeholders through an independent third-party facilitator.

Recommendation #4: Increase community awareness of Orange County Sheriff's Office Behavioral Response Unit and Orlando Police Department's Community Response Team mental health programs that provide a joint response to calls that involve mental health crisis.

**Proposed Recommendation #1:** <u>Establish and maintain a Community</u> <u>Ambassador (CA) Program that will be tasked with connecting community</u> <u>organizations, community leaders and community members as well as attend</u> <u>community events on behalf of the county providing details on key resources,</u> <u>activities and events to assist in initiatives that directly or indirectly impact crime in</u> <u>the community.</u>

#### **Proposed Short-Term Actions:**

- A. <u>Establish contacts with law enforcement and community partners to maintain</u> <u>awareness of ongoing community events.</u>
- B. <u>Continue to foster relationships and provide assistance as needed to connect them</u> <u>with county resources.</u>
- C. Attend community meetings to assist in informing on county programs and services
- D. Maintain data related to meetings, follow up and track outcomes where applicable.

**Proposed Recommendation #2:** <u>Use county media platforms to partner and</u> <u>assist law enforcement agencies in publicizing and increasing awareness of</u> <u>their agencies use of evidence-based practices and non-traditional</u> <u>approaches of community policing and engagement initiatives designed to</u> <u>further build public trust in communities historically distrustful of law</u> <u>enforcement and disproportionately impacted by gun/violent crimes.</u>

#### **Proposed Short-Term Action:**

A. <u>Community Ambassador will maintain law enforcement contacts and assist</u> with acquiring information to share on county's media platforms.



**Proposed Recommendation - Delete Recommendation #3: Implement** public safety workshops with law enforcement agencies and community stakeholders through an independent third-party facilitator. - Delete



Proposed Recommendation #4: Assist Orange County Sheriff's Office Behavioral Response Unit and Orlando Police Department's Community Response Teams, which provide a joint response to calls that involve people in mental health crisis, to increase awareness of their programs and services by using available county media platforms while also providing statistical updates on program activities.

#### **Proposed Short-Term Actions:**

- A. <u>Community Ambassador (CA) will maintain law enforcement contacts and</u> <u>assist with acquiring information to share on county's media platforms.</u>
- B. <u>CA will also maintain awareness of Orange County Government mental health</u> <u>initiatives and assist in communicating these initiatives via different venues</u> <u>and platforms.</u>
