Cara Blanco	<p>Dear Chief Deputy Torres, Thank you for speaking with me at the EPC work session on 5/29/24.</p> <p>As discussed, our community has been having issues getting the Noise Ordinance enforced since 2021.</p> <p>Yesterday at 6:01pm, Ross placed a call to OCSO non-emergency to report loud music emitting from 6004 Mountel Court, 32810. The music had been playing on and off since 8am. Ross called again at 7:15pm because the music was ongoing and we did not see the call on both Davnit and OCSO open call sites.</p> <p>He was told by a Dispatch Operator that it was not 10pm yet, but she would keep the ticket open once a deputy became available. She also said he should call again if it was still playing after 10pm. Attached are videos from yesterday. No resident should be expected to deal with excessively loud music and subwoofer vibrations from another property on a daily basis.</p> <p>This is one of numerous calls to Dispatch when incorrect information is being provided to residents seeking assistance. Ross did not know that he could have asked to speak with a supervisor. We are average citizens and can only assume that our experiences dealing with OCSO Dispatch and responding deputies are shared with other residents trying to get the same Noise Ordinance enforced.</p>	5/31/2024

	<p>I have copied EPD and BOCC personnel in this email. OCSO has been tasked with enforcing an outdated, lax Noise Ordinance that provides no recourse for residents to file a sworn complaint when deputies arrive after the nuisance has ceased. I still can't get a straight answer whether or not FL Stat 877.03 Breach of Peace; Disorderly Conduct could be issued without a deputy witnessing the act.</p> <p>This email is not a complaint. It serves to bring attention to all parties involved that Orange County's Noise Ordinance must be amended to make enforcement easier and clearer for our hard-working OCSO deputies in an area anticipating a 48% increase in population by 2050.</p>
