AN ORDINANCE OF ORANGE COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 8 (“BOATS AND WATER SAFETY”) OF THE ORANGE COUNTY CODE, PERTAINING TO BOATS AND WATER SAFETY; DESIGNATING IDLE SPEED, NO WAKE AND SLOW SPEED, MINIMUM WAKE BOATING-RESTRICTED AREAS IN CERTAIN PORTIONS OF BIG SAND LAKE, THE BUTLER CHAIN OF LAKES, THE CONWAY CHAIN OF LAKES, LAKE HART, LAKE JESSAMINE, JOHNS LAKE, LAKE MARY JANE, AND LAKE PICKETT; DESIGNATING A SWIM AREA AND VESSEL-EXCLUSION ZONE IN A PORTION OF LAKE BUTLER; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ORANGE COUNTY:

Section 1. Amendments; In General. Article II, Chapter 8, of the Orange County Code is hereby amended as set forth in Section 2 below, with additions being shown as underlined and deletions being shown as ~~strike-throughs~~.

Section 2. Amendments to Article II, Chapter 8. Article II, Chapter 8, of the Orange County Code is amended to read as follows:

CHAPTER 8

ARTICLE II. BOATS

Sec. 8-26. Authority; scope.

(a) This article is adopted pursuant to the county's home rule authority to adopt ordinances to protect the health, safety and general welfare of the citizens of the county, and further, pursuant to Sections 327.46 and 327.60, Florida Statutes~~F.S. § 327.60.~~

(b) ~~Vessels~~Boats having been declared dangerous instrumentalities pursuant to ~~F.S. §~~ Section 327.32, Florida Statutes, the board of county commissioners hereby determines

38 that the following rules and regulations are necessary in order to
protect the health, safety and general welfare of the citizens of the
county using the waterways of the county.

40 (c) Pursuant to Section 327.46, Florida Statutes, Orange County
42 has the authority to establish boating-restricted areas, including idle
speed, no wake boating-restricted areas, slow speed, minimum wake
boating restricted areas, and swim area vessel-exclusion zones.

44 (d) This article shall apply to all waterways in the
unincorporated and incorporated area of the county, unless
46 exempted by general or special law or preempted by municipal
ordinance.

48 (e) Nothing herein shall limit the authority of the board of
county commissioners or mayor to issue an emergency ordinance or
50 emergency order, respectively, addressing vessel operation due to a
natural, technological, or manmade emergency within the county.

52 ~~(d) This article shall not apply to boats, motorboats or skiers~~
~~performing in or used in shows, exhibitions or tournaments~~
54 ~~operated by and at a theme park or other amusement park. The~~
~~operators of the theme park or amusement park shall be responsible~~
56 ~~for the safe operation and equipping of all boats, motorboats and~~
~~skiers at such shows, exhibitions or tournaments.~~

58 (f) Orange County has determined that certain small gaps
between existing boating restricted areas, absent regulation, would
60 pose a safety risk to the public from rapid acceleration and
deceleration over very short distances, and the Florida Fish and
62 Wildlife Conservation Commission (“FWC”) agrees that these
small gaps, specifically those of 500 feet or less, should be closed to
64 protect public safety.

66 **Sec. 8-27. Definitions.**

68 The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this
article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section,
69 except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning. If
any definition is inconsistent with the definition of that term in
72 Section 327.02, Florida Statutes, the definition in Section 327.02,
Florida Statutes, shall take precedence:

74 *Boating-restricted area* means an area of the waters of the state
within which the operation of vessels is subject to specified
76 restrictions or from which vessels are excluded.

78 *Idle speed, no wake* means that a vessel must proceed at a speed
no greater than that which will maintain steerageway and headway.
At no time is any vessel required to proceed so slowly that the

80 operator is unable to maintain control over the vessel or any other
81 vessel or object that it has under tow.

82 ~~*Boats shall mean all rafts, skiffs, dredges, canoes, dugouts,*~~
83 ~~*dinghies, rowboats, sailboats and motorboats. Sailboards are*~~
84 ~~*specifically excluded from this definition.*~~

85 ~~*Motorboats shall mean any boat that is propelled or powered*~~
86 ~~*by any internal or external combustion engine or motor.*~~

87 *Operate* means to be in charge of, in command of, or in actual
88 physical control of a vessel upon the waters of the state, to exercise
89 control over or to have responsibility for a vessel's navigation or
90 safety while the vessel is underway upon the waters of the state, or
91 to control or steer a vessel being towed by another vessel upon the
92 waters of the state.

93 ~~*Operator shall mean any person in charge of or having*~~
94 ~~*immediate control over a boat, whether such person is the owner*~~
95 ~~*of the boat, or a permitted or an unauthorized user of the boat.*~~
96 ~~*means any person in charge of, in command of, or in actual physical*~~
97 ~~*control of a vessel upon the waters of the state, exercising control*~~
98 ~~*over or having responsibility for a vessel's navigation or safety*~~
99 ~~*while the vessel is underway upon the waters of the state, or*~~
100 ~~*controlling or steering a vessel being towed by another vessel upon*~~
101 ~~*the waters of the state.*~~

102 *Owner* means a person, other than a lienholder, having the
103 property in or title to a vessel. The term includes a person entitled to
104 the use or possession of a vessel subject to an interest in another
105 person which is reserved or created by agreement and securing
106 payment of performance of an obligation. The term does not include
107 a lessee under a lease not intended as security.

108 *Person* means an individual, partnership, firm, corporation,
109 association, or other entity.

110 *Slow speed, minimum wake* means that a vessel must be fully off
111 plane and completely settled into the water. It may not proceed at a
112 speed greater than that speed which is reasonable and prudent to
113 avoid the creation of an excessive wake or other hazardous condition
114 under the existing circumstances. A vessel that is:

- 115 (a) Operating on a plane is not proceeding at slow speed
116 minimum wake;
- 117 (b) In the process of coming off plane and settling into the water
118 or coming up onto plane is not proceeding at slow speed
minimum wake;

120 (c) Operating at a speed that creates a wake which unreasonably
122 or unnecessarily endangers other vessels is not proceeding at
slow speed minimum wake;

124 (d) Completely off plane and which has fully settled into the
water and is proceeding without wake or with minimum
126 wake is proceeding at slow speed minimum wake.

126 Vessel is synonymous with boat as referenced in s. 1(b), Art. VII
128 of the State Constitution and includes every description of
watercraft, barge, and airboat, other than a seaplane on the water,
used or capable of being used as a means of transportation on water.

130 Vessel-exclusion zone means an area from which all vessels or
certain classes of vessels are excluded.

132 Waters of the state means any navigable waters of the United
134 States within the territorial limits of the state of Florida, the marginal
sea adjacent to the state of Florida and the high seas when navigated
136 as a part of a journey or ride to or from the shore of the state of
Florida, and all the inland lakes, rivers, and canals under the
jurisdiction of the state of Florida.

138 Waterway shall means any waters, lakes, canals, streams,
140 lagoons or connecting waters, whether natural or manmade,
partially or wholly within the boundaries of the county.

142 **Sec. 8-28. Compliance with federal and state law.**

144 All ~~vessels~~boats operating on or about the waterways of the
146 county shall comply with all applicable federal and state laws,
rules and regulations. The provisions of this article are
supplementary to such federal and state laws, rules and regulations.

148 **Sec. 8-29. Enforcement, Penalties for violations.**

150 ~~Violations of this article shall be punished as provided~~
152 ~~in section 1-9.~~

154 (a) This article may be enforced by any law enforcement
officer as defined in Section 943.10, Florida Statutes.

156 (b) Violations of sections 8-31 through 8-33 may be
158 punished as provided in Sections 327.72 through 327.74, Florida
Statutes, by issuance of a uniform boating citation.

160 (c) Violations of section 8-28 shall be punished as
162 provided in section 1-9.

164 **Sec. 8-30. Exemptions. ~~Minimum safety and lighting~~**

168 (a) The following vessels are exempt from the
170 prohibitions contained in sections 8-31 through 8-33:

172 (1) Vessels operating under emergency
conditions during an emergency;

174 (2) Vessels used solely for law enforcement,

176 (3) Vessels used by an employee, officer, or
178 authorized agent of local, state, or federal government for
ensuring compliance with local, state, or federal law or for
180 performing other official duties.

312 shall be equipped with at least one (1) adequate wearable lifesaving
device for every occupant.

314 **Sec. 8-31. Location of permitted idle speed, no wake**

318 (a) The following described waters of the state or
320 portions of waters of the state are hereby established as idle speed,
322 no wake boating-restricted areas:

324 (1) Butler Chain of Lakes

326 a. The area of water at the Lake Down Boat Ramp, in Lake
328 Down, in the Butler Chain of Lakes, between points 28
330 29.702N, 81 31.209W and 28 29.665N, 81 31.158W,
332 extending to the southern shoreline, as shown on the attached
map labeled Appendix “A-1”: “No Wake Zone, Butler Chain
of Lakes”.

334 b. The area of water at the R.D. Keene Boat Ramp, on Lake
336 Isleworth, in the Butler Chain of Lakes, between points 28
338 28.267N, 81 31.879W and 28 28.264N, 81 31.847W,
extending to the southern shoreline, as shown on the attached
map labeled Appendix “A-2”: “No Wake Zone, Butler Chain
of Lakes”.

340 c. Those channels, canals, land cuts, grassy areas, and blind
342 corners between Lake Tibet (28 28.111N, 81 31.328W) and
344 Lake Chase (28 28.158N, 81 31.307W) in the Butler Chain
of Lakes, as shown on the attached map labeled Appendix
“A-3”: “No Wake Zone, Butler Chain of Lakes”.

346 d. The area of water on Lake Tibet, in the Butler Chain of
348 Lakes, from point 28 27.539N, 81 30.931W extending to the
northern shoreline of the entire cove, as shown on the
350 attached map labeled Appendix “A-4”: “No Wake Zone,
Butler Chain of Lakes”.

352 e. The area of water on Lake Sheen, in the Butler Chain of
354 Lakes, between points 28 26.113N, 81 30.758W and 28
26.046N, 81 30.769W, located within 500’ from a public
356 fuel pump located at 28 26.081N, 81 30.712W, and
extending to the eastern shoreline, as shown on the attached
358 map labeled Appendix “A-5”: “No Wake Zone, Butler Chain
of Lakes”.

360 (2) Conway Chain of Lakes

362 a. The area of water near the Randolph Boat Ramp on Little
364 Lake Conway, in the Conway Chain of Lakes, between
points 28 28.661N, 81 21.969W and 28 28.660N, 81
366 21.941W, extending to the southern shoreline, as shown on
the attached map labeled Appendix “B-1”: “No Wake Zone,
368 Conway Chain of Lakes”.

370 b. The area of water near the Ferncreek Boat Ramp on Little
372 Lake Conway, in the Conway Chain of Lakes, between
points 28 29.352N, 81 21.583W and 28 29.354N, 81
374 21.572W, extending to the northern shoreline, as shown on
the attached map labeled Appendix “B-2”: “No Wake Zone,
Conway Chain of Lakes”.

376 c. The area of water near the Warren Park kayak launch in the
378 south lobe of Lake Conway, in the Conway Chain of Lakes,
from points 28 27.694N, 81 20.535W and 28 27.683N, 81
380 20.525W, extending to the northeastern shoreline, as shown
on the attached map labeled Appendix “B-3”: “No Wake
382 Zone, Conway Chain of Lakes”.

384 d. The area of water near the Perkins Boat Ramp on the south
386 lobe of Lake Conway, in the Conway Chain of Lakes,
between points 28 27.506N, 81 21.185W and 28 27.495N,
388 81 21.182W, extending to the eastern shoreline, as shown on
the attached map labeled Appendix “B-4”: “No Wake Zone,
Conway Chain of Lakes”.

390 (3) Lake Jessamine

392 a. The area of water at the Bywater Boat Ramp on Lake
394 Jessamine, from points 28 28.628N, 81 23.053W and 28
28.612N, 81 23.052W extending to the eastern shoreline, as
396 shown on the attached map labeled Appendix “C-1”: “No
Wake Zone, Lake Jessamine”.

398 b. The area of water at the Woodsmere Boat Ramp on Lake
400 Jessamine, from points 28 28.942N, 81 23.386W and 28
28.924N, 81 23.381W extending to the western shoreline, as
402 shown on the attached map labeled Appendix “C-2”: “No
Wake Zone, Lake Jessamine”.

404 (b) No owner, operator, or person in command of any
406 vessel shall permit the operation of or operate a vessel within a
boating-restricted area designated by subsection (a) at a speed in
408 excess of idle speed, no wake.

410 (a) ~~All boats and motorboats shall, whenever possible,~~
412 ~~keep at least three hundred (300) feet behind any boat towing a~~
~~skier and shall stay clear of, by at least one hundred (100) feet, any~~
414 ~~boat or motorboat anchored or used for fishing. When a ski jump~~
~~is in use, all other boats shall, whenever possible, stay at least one~~
416 ~~hundred (100) feet away on either side and five hundred (500) feet~~
~~behind the ski jump.~~

418 (b) ~~No person shall operate any boat recklessly,~~
420 ~~overload any boat, indulge in any motorboat race, make sudden~~
~~turns at excessive speed, follow too closely to other boats, or~~
422 ~~operate any boat in such a way that it may endanger other boats,~~
~~life or property.~~

424 (c) ~~All motorboat operators shall sit within the confines~~
426 ~~of the boat and shall require that their passengers do likewise.~~
~~Bowriding and gunwhale riding are strictly prohibited.~~

428 (d) ~~Care shall be taken by the operators of all~~
430 ~~motorboats and personal watercraft to prevent damage from their~~
~~wash, bow wave or stern wave, or from objects towed by such~~
432 ~~boats to other boats, docks, piers, shorelines and boathouses.~~
~~Boats, motorboats and personal watercraft shall not create a wake~~
434 ~~while operating within a canal, or within one hundred (100) feet of~~
~~the shoreline, docks, piers, bridges or boathouses, or any other~~
436 ~~object arising from the water (excluding ski jumps or slalom~~
~~courses) except when picking up or dropping off a waterskier. The~~

442 (e) ~~All boats and motorboats towing water skiers,~~
444 ~~aquaplanes or other devices shall operate in a counterclockwise~~
~~direction of the waterway whenever possible.~~

446 **Sec. 8-32. Location of permitted slow speed, minimum wake**
448 **boating-restricted areas; actions regulated. Speed limits;**
450 **posting.**

452 (a) The following described waters of the state or portions
454 of waters of the state are hereby established as slow speed, minimum
wake boating-restricted areas:

456 (1) Big Sand Lake

458 a. Those channels, canals, land cuts, and grassy areas on Big
460 Sand Lake from point 28 26.408N, 81 28.877W to point 28
462 26.292N, 81 28.697W. A blind corner is located at point 28
464 26.410N, 81 28.832W, proceeding in an easterly direction to
the canal located at 28 26.319N, 81 28.750W and ending at
28 26.292N, 81 28.697W. This zone is closing the gap within
500 feet between the coordinates, as shown on the attached
map labeled Appendix “D-1”: “Slow Speed, Minimum
Wake Zone, Big Sand Lake”.

466 b. Those channels, canals, and land cuts on Big Sand Lake,
468 between points 28 25.774N, 81 29.967W and 28 25.799N,
470 81 30.004W, as shown on the attached map labeled
Appendix “D-2”: “Slow Speed, Minimum Wake Zone, Big
Sand Lake”.

472 c. Those channels, canals, land cuts, and grassy and wooded
474 areas on Big Sand Lake between points 28 25.744N, 81
476 29.019W and 28 25.572N, 81 28.955W. This zone presents
478 two blind corners at the coordinates, zone is closing the gap
within 500 feet between the coordinates, as shown on the
attached map labeled Appendix “D-3”: “Slow Speed,
Minimum Wake Zone, Big Sand Lake”.

480 (2) Butler Chain of Lakes

482 a. Those channels, canals, land cuts, blind corners, grassy

e. Those channels, canals, and land cuts on Lake Down, in the Butler Chain of Lakes, from 28 30.132N, 81 32.105W extending to the western and southern shoreline, as shown on the attached map labeled Appendix “E-3”: “Slow Speed, Minimum Wake Zone, Butler Chain of Lakes”.
