WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 327.46, Florida Statutes, Orange County has the authority to establish boating-restricted areas, including idle speed, no wake boating-restricted areas and vessel-exclusion zones; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners finds it to be in the interest of public health, safety, and welfare to designate the boating-restricted areas set forth herein.
