# Background

## Noise Pollution Control Ordinance Overview

- **Orange County's Noise Pollution Control Ordinance (Chapter 15, Article V) prohibits noise that is either:**
  - More than the allowable sound level limits, or
  - Is plainly audible from a specified distance.
- **These standards apply to private or public property, whether commercial or residential, including rights-of-way.**



# Background

## Noise Pollution Control Ordinance Overview

### ■ Environmental Protection Division (EPD)

– Enforces sound emanating from commercial and industrial facilities under Section 15-182, Table 1:

Table 1: Code Standard - Sound assessed using sound level meter (dB=decibels) time weighted average:

Land Use Category	Measurement	Time of Day	Sound Level Limit (dBA)
<b>Noise Sensitive Zone</b>	Time Averaged (LEQ)	Any time	55 dB
	Impulsive	7:00 a.m. - 10:00 p.m.	60 dB
	Impulsive	10:01 p.m. - 6:59 a.m.	Not allowed
<b>Residential Area</b>	Time Averaged (LEQ)	7:00 a.m. - 10:00 p.m.	60 dB
	Time Averaged (LEQ)	10:01 p.m. - 6:59 a.m.	55 dB
	Impulsive	7:00 a.m. - 10:00 p.m.	65 dB
	Impulsive	10:01 p.m. - 6:59 a.m.	Not allowed



# Background

## Noise Pollution Control Ordinance Overview

### ▪ Orange County Sheriff’s Office (OCSO)

– Enforces sound emanating from residential and commercial sites which may involve the consumption of alcohol or any suspected illegal activities and noise disturbance complaints involving "breach of the peace" as defined in F.S. § 877.03. Under Section 15-183, Table 2:

Table 2: Plainly Audible Procedure Time and Distance Requirements :

Underlying Land Use Category (from which noise emanates)	Time of Day	Distance
Residential Area	7:00 a.m. - 10:00 p.m.	500 feet or more
	10:01 p.m.- 6:59 a.m.	150 feet or more
Nonresidential Area	7:00 a.m. - 10:00 p.m.	500 feet or more
	10:01 p.m. - 6:59 a.m.	300 feet or more

## Public Comments

- **Concern 1:** Citizen indicated noise ordinance and Orange County Sheriff Office's (OCSO) response is flawed
- **Concern 2:** Noise weaponized - legalized harassment
- **Concern 3:** Request distance be reduced for plainly audible standard



# Background

## BCC Comments/Complaints Received

### County Commissioners complaints received

- **Concern 1:** Residential/Residential; music & unamplified human voices
- **Concern 2:** Commercial bar/Residential; noise from music and vibration from bass frequencies
- **Concern 3:** County more urbanized- code needs to be amended to be more effective. May be outdated





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# Scope of Work

## Process

### ■ EPD contracted an environmental consulting firm to perform this evaluation

#### Key elements and objectives

- Assess the effectiveness, considering allowable sound level limits and the “plainly audible” standard
- Identify the strengths and weaknesses
- Compare with other noise regulations at different jurisdictions
- Evaluate a mechanism to address compatibility issues
- Conduct stakeholder engagement
- Provide recommendations and draft code revisions

#### Phased approach

- Phase 1:
  - Task 1 – Evaluation of Sound Level Limits and Plainly Audible Standard
  - Task 2 – Comparative Analysis of Noise Ordinances
- Phase 2:
  - Task 1 – Enforcement Procedures and Penalties
  - Task 2 – Code Exemptions and Variances
  - Task 3 – Legally Defensible Measurement for Plainly Audible Standard
  - Task 4 – Stakeholder Engagement
  - Task 5 – Recommendations and Draft Code Revisions

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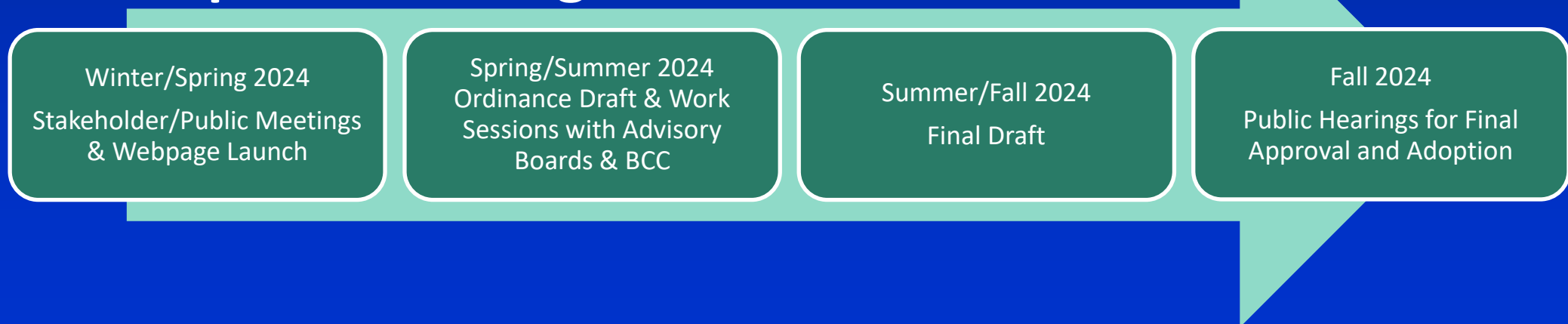


# Schedule Timeline

- **Very aggressive timeline, consultants are committed to do their best to stay on track**
- **Phase 1 completed, consultant to submit a short report and jurisdictions comparison table**



- EPD gathering input from stakeholders, launch an informative webpage
- Work sessions with Advisory Boards and BCC
- If BCC directs staff to change Code, present a final draft code to the Advisory Boards
- Schedule public hearing with BCC - Fall 2024.
