Orange County Government received \$219 million in federal disaster recovery funding (CDBG-DR funds) to help communities in hard-hit areas recover from Hurricane Ian. Additionally, the County received an allocation of \$33 million to address the remaining needs resulting from Hurricane Milton.

Orange County aims to provide our residents and community partners with the most up to date information as the County moves forward with its implementation of the CDBG-DR programs. Request for Applications Now Open!

Orange County, through its Housing and Community Development Division, is soliciting applications for Public Facilities and Housing projects, and Planning Studies, to be implemented as part of the Community Development Block Grant – Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) program. Applications must be completed and submitted online through ZoomGrants, which can be accessed through the website: www.ocfl.net/CDBG-DR.

The Request for Applications (RFA) process began on **Wednesday**, **August 27**, **2025**, and will end on **Friday**, **October 10**, **2025**, **at 5:00 p.m.** The Public Facilities and Housing Projects RFA is open for state certified 501(c)(3) Non-Profit Organizations and Public Housing Authorities (PHA). The Planning Studies RFA is open to Orange County Departments and Divisions, local municipalities, and quasi-governmental agencies (such as water management districts and a regional planning council). Proposals will be reviewed by an evaluation committee(s) for consistency with federal regulations, unmet needs and priorities detailed in the CDBG-DR Action Plan, feasibility of the project(s), and other criteria outlined in the RFA.

CDBG-DR Program Information

Public Facilities and Housing Projects:

- Funding Available: \$31,576,714 for public facilities, \$15,000,000 for housing projects
- Public Facilities Purpose: Funding for the rehabilitation and/or construction of public facilities serving low- to moderate-income persons or limited clientele, or facilities located in low- to moderate income areas.
- Housing Purpose: Funding for rehabilitation or reconstruction of existing affordable rental
 units; funding for construction of new affordable housing units specifically for permanent
 supportive housing and/or housing for individuals with special needs (such as group home
 facilities).

Planning Studies:

- Funding Available: \$3,500,000
- Purpose: Funding for planning activities, to include data gathering, studies, analysis, plan
 preparation, and the identification of actions that will implement such plans. Examples of
 projects include, but are not limited to, infrastructure studies (stormwater, floodplain
 studies); resilience and sustainability studies; mitigations studies, etc.

Minimum Eligibility Criteria

Public Facilities:

- The proposed project:
 - Demonstrates a tie-back to Hurricane lan,
 - Benefits low-moderate income persons,
 - Benefits a low-moderate area, and/or;
 - Enhances resiliency.

Housing Projects:

- The proposed project:
 - Demonstrates a tie-back to Hurricane Ian,
 - Benefits low-moderate income persons,
 - Enhances resiliency.

Planning Studies:

• The proposed study must address the impact of disaster through mitigation and resiliency related activities.

Evaluation Criteria

Projects will be scored on a scale of 0 to 100 points for each evaluation criteria listed below.

- Project Description and Need
- Agency Competency
- Budget Justification and Leverage of Funds
- Project Feasibility
- Implementation and Outcomes

To ensure that projects are selected fairly, an evaluation committee composed of a variety of stakeholders will conduct an extensive review of all application submissions. The evaluation committee will provide the expertise necessary for scoring the project submissions and will be responsible for reviewing and scoring projects based on the evaluation criteria.

The mandatory pre-award technical assistance workshops will be conducted in person on Thursday, September 4, 2025, at the Orange County Internal Operations Center (IOC) 1 located at 450 East South Street, Orlando, Florida 32801. The workshops will be conducted as follows:

The workshops will provide technical assistance and information about the program requirements, funding criteria for project submissions, and details about the application process. Orange County's CDBG-DR Homeowner Housing Rehabilitation, Replacement, and Reconstruction program — Orange County Recovers — remains open and actively accepting applications. If your home was damaged by Hurricane Ian and you still have unmet housing needs, now is the time to apply. Visit **OrangeCountyRecovers.com** or call 321-382-3514 for assistance.

The program has seen strong community interest and is making steady progress in helping residents recover. To date, 335 applications have been received, with 122 applicants already determined eligible. Each case is being handled by a dedicated team of case managers working diligently to move homeowners through the next steps in the process.

On July 22, 2025, Orange County and HUD officially executed the Grant Agreement for the CDBG-DR funds. County staff are now moving forward with the next phases of the program, which include administrative tasks, development of program documents such as marketing materials, program guidelines, and policies and procedures, as well as community outreach efforts. Additional updates will be provided as the program moves into the implementation phase. We appreciate the continued engagement of residents, partners, and stakeholders as we move forward with building a stronger, more resilient Orange County.

- April 9, 2024: Grant Agreement for CDBG-DR funds executed between Orange County and HUD.
- June 17, 2024: Orange County CDBG-DR Final Public and DRGR Action Plan was reviewed and approved by HUD.
- **Summer 2024:** Program policies and procedures are being developed for the Infrastructure, Public Facilities, Mitigation and Planning programs.
- December 5 & 8 2024: Notice of Funding Availability was posted for the CDBG-DR Infrastructure, Public Facilities, Mitigation and Planning programs.

- Fall 2025 (Tentative): Launch RFA for New Affordable Housing Construction

- May 15, 2025: Public comment period for the Hurricane Milton Action Plan to close.
- June 3, 2025: Public hearing for the Hurricane Milton Action Plan conducted by the BCC.
- June 18, 2025: Hurricane Milton Action Plan submitted to HUD for review and approval.
- July 3, 2025: Orange County CDBG-DR Action Plan received the final approval from HUD.
- July 22, 2025: Grant Agreement for CDBG-DR funds executed between Orange County and HUD.
- Fall 2025: Update program policies and procedures for the Infrastructure, Public Facilities, Mitigation and Planning programs to comply with Milton requirements
- Early 2026: (Tentative) Program Implementation
