

The holiday season can get hectic, so here's a quick guide to help you properly dispose of some common holiday waste.



- earlier than 6 p.m. the night before and no later than 6 a.m. on collection day.
- · Keep three feet away from mailboxes, parked cars, and low-hanging tree limbs.
- · Lids must fully close; do not overfill.
- · Have three feet of clearance between carts so trucks can safely use the mechanical arm.
- Face handles toward the house and lid arrows toward the street.
- · After collection, put empty carts away on the same day.

Christmas Tree Disposal

Live Christmas trees can be set out on your yard waste collection day.

- Trees over six feet should be cut in half.
- Remove the stand and all decorations before placing at the curb.
- Artificial trees that do not fit in the garbage cart can be set out for large item collection (the same day as yard waste collection).
- Remember, disposal by burning causes air pollution and is prohibited in Orange County. Visit ocfl.net/OpenBurningRules to find out more.

NO RECHARGEABLE BATTERIES IN CARTS

Lithium-ion batteries can cause fires! These batteries are found in smartphones, laptops, power tools, toys, and more.

Visit Call2Recycle.org to find a convenient disposal location, or bring them to a county household hazardous waste (HHW) drop-off location or community collection event.

Prior to disposal, cover all the terminals with tape, and separate them from other batteries.

Paint and chemicals limited to 25 gallons per vehicle. Please cover all lithium battery terminals with tape and separate them from other batteries. No regular garbage or commercial waste accepted.
