Pretrial Release (PTR)

You have been court ordered released to Pretrial Release (PTR) supervision. This means that you do not need to pay a bond to be released from Jail. A Pretrial Services staff member will interview you shortly, they will explain the conditions of your release and what you are required to do. Generally you will be placed on either telephone monitoring (you are required to call in as instructed) or office visits (you are required to meet with a Supervision Officer), it will depend on your charges and what the Judge has ordered. You will need to supply & verify your address and telephone number and meet any other release conditions ordered by the Judge prior to your release.

Bond & Court-Ordered Pretrial Release (PTR)

You have been given a Bond amount with the condition of Pretrial Release (PTR) supervision. This means before being released onto the Pretrial Release Program you need to have your bond paid. After your bond is paid you will be interviewed by a Pretrial Services staff member. During this interview you will be made aware of the specific conditions of your Pretrial Release and what is involved in being on Pretrial Release supervision. Generally you will be placed on either telephone monitoring (you are required to call in as instructed) or office visits (you are required to meet with a Supervision Officer), it will depend on your charges and what the Judge has ordered. You will need to supply & verify your address and telephone number and meet any other release conditions ordered by the Judge prior to your release.

Pretrial Release (PTR) or Bond

The Judge has given you the option to either pay bond or be released onto the Pretrial Release (PTR) program. If you choose to pay your Bond, once it is paid you will be processed for Release and not be on supervision. If you choose Pretrial Release, you will be interviewed by a staff member who will explain the conditions of your release and what you are required to do. Generally you will be placed on either telephone monitoring (you are required to call in as instructed) or office visits (you are required to meet with a Supervision Officer), it will depend on your charges and what the Judge has ordered. You will need to supply & verify your address and telephone number and meet any other release conditions ordered by the Judge prior to your release.
